

Use the right-hand, 5-way controls located on your steering wheel to scroll through, highlight and make minor adjustments within a selected menu. Press **VOL+ or VOL-** to increase or decrease your volume level.

PUSH BUTTON START* allows you to start your vehicle by pressing the ENGINE START STOP button while fully pressing down on the brake pedal. Before the engine shuts down, a message appears in the information display, allowing the driver to override the shutdown feature. Press the button again to switch the engine off.

Note: Your intelligent access transmitter must be inside the vehicle for the ignition to start. Keyless warning alert sounds the horn twice when you exit the vehicle with the intelligent access transmitter and the keyless vehicle is on.

- 12 A. POWER LIFTGATE CONTROL* lets you open or close your power liftgate from the driver seat. To use, press the control.
 - **B. HILL START ASSIST** keeps your vehicle stationary long enough to move your foot from the brake pedal to the accelerator pedal when your vehicle is on a slope. Press the control to switch this feature off. It turns back on automatically after you re-start your vehicle.
 - C. ADVANCETRAC[®] WITH RSC[®] (ROLL STABILITY CONTROL[™]) automatically activates when you start your engine and helps you keep control of your vehicle when on a slippery surface. The electronic stability control portion of the system helps avoid skids and lateral slides, while the roll stability control helps avoid a vehicle rollover. The traction control system helps avoid drive wheel spin and loss of traction.

TRAILER SWAY CONTROL* applies your vehicle brakes at individual wheels and, if necessary, reduces engine power. If the trailer begins to sway, the stability control light flashes and the message TRAILER SWAY REDUCE SPEED appears in the information display. The first thing to do is slow down your vehicle, then pull safely to the side of the road and check for proper tongue load and trailer load distribution. For more information, please refer to the *Towing* chapter in your *Owner's Manual*.

13 INTEGRATED TRAILER BRAKE

CONTROLLER* assists in smooth and effective trailer braking by powering the trailer's electric or electric over hydraulic brakes with a proportional output based on the towing vehicle's brake pressure.

Use the **GAIN** adjustment buttons to increase or decrease the braking feature's power output to the trailer. Adjust the **GAIN** by:

- A. Pressing the GAIN + or GAIN buttons to increase or decrease the setting to the desired starting point. A GAIN setting of 6.0 is a good starting point for heavier loads.
- B. Testing the adjusted GAIN setting.
- 1. In a traffic-free environment, tow the trailer on a dry, level surface at a speed of 20-25 mph (30-40 km/h) and squeeze the manual control lever completely.
- If the trailer wheels lock up (the tires will squeal), reduce the GAIN setting. If the trailer wheels turn freely, increase the GAIN setting.
- **3.** The proper **GAIN** setting will be at the point just below trailer wheel lock-up. If towing a heavier trailer, trailer wheel lockup may not be attainable even with the maximum **GAIN** setting of 10.

INSTRUMENT PANEL (CONTINUED)

4 FOUR-WHEEL DRIVE (4WD)*

operates in four modes for a variety of road conditions:

2H (4X2) mode delivers power to the rear wheels only, that is appropriate for normal, on-road driving on dry pavement and provides the best fuel economy.

4A (4X4 AUTO) mode provides electronic control four-wheel drive with power delivered to all four wheels, as required, for increased traction. This mode is appropriate for all on-road driving conditions, such as dry road surfaces, wet pavement, snow and gravel.

4H (4X4) mode provides electronically locked four-wheel drive power to all four wheels. This position is not recommended for use on dry pavement and is only intended for severe winter or off-road conditions, such as deep snow, ice or shallow sand.

4L (4X4) mode provides electronically locked four-wheel drive when extra power at reduced speeds is needed. Use this mode for off-road, low-speed operation, such as climbing steep grades, pulling a boat out of the water and more. Refer to the *Four-Wheel Drive* (4WD) chapter in your *Owner's Manual*.

16 AUDIO SYSTEM CONTROLS

A. EJECT: Press to eject a CD. B. CD SLOT: Insert a CD.

E. HEATED REAR WINDOW: Press to switch on the rear defrost.

F. AIR DISTRIBUTION CONTROL:

Press to switch airflow from the windshield, instrument panel, or footwell vents on or off. The system can distribute air through any combination of these vents.

G. RECIRCULATED AIR CONTROL:

Press to switch between outside air and recirculated air.

H. FAN SPEED -: Press to decrease the volume of air circulated in the vehicle.

I. AUTO: Press to switch on the automatic temperature control.

J. FAN SPEED +: Press to increase the volume of air circulated in the vehicle.

K. DUAL: Turn to increase or decrease the air temperature on the passenger side of the vehicle.

GETTING STARTED WITH YOUR SYNC SYSTEM

SYNC is a hands-free, voice recognition system used for entertainment, information and communication. SYNC. Say the Word.

BEFORE YOU GET STARTED

- Set up your owner account at SyncMyRide.com (U.S.) or SyncMyRide.ca (Canada). Register by following the on-screen instructions. After registering, you can see what services you may be eligible for.
- 2. SYNC uses a wireless connection called *Bluetooth*[®] to communicate with your phone. Switch on *Bluetooth* mode in your phone's menu options. This lets your phone find SYNC.

PAIRING YOUR PHONE WITH SYNC

In order to use the many features of SYNC, such as making a phone call, you must first connect or pair your phone with SYNC.

TO PAIR YOUR PHONE FOR THE FIRST TIME

1. Make sure that your vehicle is in park (P), then switch on your ignition and radio.

2. Press the phone button U. When the display indicates *No Phone Found*, press *OK*.

3. When Add Bluetooth Device? appears in the display, press OK.

4. When *Find SYNC* appears in the display, press *OK*. When prompted on your phone's display, enter the PIN provided by SYNC into your phone.

5. The display indicates when the pairing is successful.

Note: The system may prompt you to -

- Set your phone as the primary or favorite (the primary phone receives messages and voicemail).
- Download your phone book (required to use the full set of voice commands).
- Switch on 911 Assist®.

TIPS

- Make sure you accept the request from SYNC to access your phone.
- To pair subsequent phones, please refer to Pairing Subsequent Phones in the SYNC chapter of your Owner's Manual.
- If you are experiencing pairing problems, try performing a clean pairing by deleting your services from SYNC and deleting the SYNC connection from your phone, and then repeat the process.

Note: You must download your phone book to make phone calls with voice commands by name.

MAKING A PHONE CALL

Use SYNC to make a phone call to anyone in your phone book by pressing the of button and when prompted, say any of the following voice commands:

Call <name></name>	Call <name> at work</name>
Call <name> on cell</name>	Call <name> at home</name>

For example, you could say "Call Jake Smith at home". SYNC repeats the command back to you and dials the number.

Note: You can also make phone calls by pressing the $\sqrt{\xi}$ button. When prompted, say the voice command "Dial", then verbally say the phone number.

ANSWERING INCOMING CALLS

Whenever you have an incoming call, the name and number of the person calling appears in your display. Press the phone button to answer an incoming call. You can hang up at any time by pressing and holding the phone button **?**.

DO NOT DISTURB MODE

This feature blocks incoming calls and text messages and saves them for later. You still have access to outgoing calls when this feature is active. Say the voice command "Do not disturb on" to enable and "Do not disturb off" to disable.

SEATING-TO-CARGO VERSATILITY

COMFORT

Note: Before folding the second- or thirdrow seats, make sure to flip down the head restraints by pulling on the strap, and remove all items from the floor and seats.

TO FOLD THE FLAT-FOLDING THIRD-ROW SEATS TO THE LOAD FLOOR

Pull up on the **Handle** located behind the seatback while pushing the seatback forward and down into the seat cushion.

Note: You may need to exert a moderate force to move the seat forward and down.

To return the seats to an upright seating position

Lift and pull the seat rearward until the latch engages fully.

E-Z ENTRY INTO THE THIRD-ROW SEATS

The E-Z entry seat allows for easier entry and exit to and from the third-row seat.

To enter the third-row seating area

1. Fold the head restraint forward.

2. Pull up on Lever 1.

3. Fold down the second-row seat and release the handle.

- 4. Pull the handle up again until the seat releases from the floor.
- 5. Push the seat upward and fold it away from the third row.

To return the seat to an upright seating position

1. Push the seat down and latch it to the floor.

POWERFOLD® THIRD-ROW SEAT*



The 60/40 split-folding bench seat uses a power-activated seatback release. Fold one side or both down for more flexibility.

The controls are located on the right-hand rear quarter trim panel that is accessible from the liftgate area.

Note: Make sure you unfasten all of the safety belts.

To lower

- 1. Make sure you fold the head restraints down first.
- 2. Press and hold the *FOLD* control. Release the control once the seats fold completely.

MOONROOF*

The moonroof control is on the overhead console. It has a one-touch open and close feature. To stop its motion during the one-touch operation, press the control a second time.

To open, press and release the *SLIDE* control. It stops short of the fully opened position to help reduce wind noise. Press the *SLIDE* control again to fully open the moonroof. To close, pull and release the *SLIDE* control.

To vent, press and release the *TILT* control. Pull and hold the *TILT* control to close the moonroof.

Once you close the moonroof, you can still open or close the sliding shade manually. Pull the shade toward the front of the vehicle to close it.

COMFORT (CONTINUED)

AMBIENT LIGHTING*

When activated, ambient lighting illuminates key areas of your interior with a choice of colors.

To access and make adjustments

1. Press the Settings icon > Vehicle > Ambient Lighting.

2. Touch the desired color.

3. Use the scroll bar to increase or decrease the intensity.

To turn the feature on or off, press the power button.

REAR HEATED SEATS*

Press the heated seat (control repeatedly to cycle through the settings and off. More lights indicate a higher setting.

MEMORY FEATURE*

The memory function saves and recalls the positions of the driver seat, power mirrors and adjustable pedals. Use the memory controls located on the left side of the driver's seat $\frac{1}{2}$ to program and then recall memory positions.

To program

1. Switch on the ignition.

2. Move the memory features to your desired position.

3. Press and hold the 1 button 🖞 until you hear a tone.

You can now use these controls to recall the set memory positions.



CONVENIENCE

SELECTSHIFT AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION*

Gives you the ability to manually change gears if you like. To use, move the gearshift lever from drive (D) to manual (M).

- Press the (+) button to upshift.
- Press the (–) button to downshift.

To return back to automatic shifts, move the gearshift lever from manual (M) to drive (D).

POWER LIFTGATE OPERATION*

You can open your power liftgate three different ways:

- Push the control on the instrument panel.
- Press the control on your remote entry transmitter twice within three seconds.
- Press the liftgate control located on the inside of the liftgate handle.

To close with the rear cargo area button, press and release the control located on the left, rear quarter panel.

Lets you lock or unlock the doors without using a key. You can operate the keypad with the factory-set, 5-digit entry code. This code is on the owner's wallet card in the glove box. To unlock all doors, enter the factory-set code or your personal code, then press **3-4** within five seconds.

To lock all doors, press and hold **7-8** and **9-0** at the same time with the driver door closed. You do not need to enter the keypad code first.

INTELLIGENT ACCESS*

Note: Your transmitter must be within 3 feet (1 meter) of the vehicle for intelligent access to function properly.

To unlock the doors, press any number on the SecuriCode keyless entry keypad.

To lock the doors, press the lock button on the transmitter, or use the SecuriCode keypad.

Remote start allows you to start the engine from outside your vehicle using your key. To start, press and then press twice within three seconds. Your vehicle runs for 5, 10, or 15 minutes, depending on the setting. See the Information *Displays* chapter in your *Owner's Manual* to select the duration of the remote start system.

Once inside, apply the brake while pressing the ENGINE START STOP button. Shift into drive (D) and go. If you have an integrated keyhead transmitter, insert the key into the ignition and switch the ignition on as you normally would before driving. To switch the engine off from outside the vehicle after using your remote start, press (2) once.

ESSENTIAL FEATURES

EASY FUEL® SYSTEM

Your vehicle's fuel system allows you to open the fuel filler door, insert the nozzle and start fueling. Wait 10 seconds from the time the refueling nozzle is shut off until you remove the nozzle from the vehicle to allow residual fuel in the nozzle to drain into the tank.

The Easy Fuel system is self-sealing and therefore protected against dust, dirt, water, snow and ice. If you need to fill your fuel tank with a portable fuel container, use the fuel funnel which is attached to the underside of the spare tire cover or is included with the tire changing tools. Slowly insert the funnel into the Easy Fuel system and fill the tank with fuel from the container. When done, clean the funnel or properly dispose of it. Extra funnels can be purchased from your authorized dealer.

Note: Do not use aftermarket funnels as they will not work with the Easy Fuel system and may cause damage.

FUEL TYPE AND FUEL TANK CAPACITY

Depending on your vehicle, your fuel tank has a capacity of either 28 gallons (106L) or 33.5 gallons (126.8L).

Use only UNLEADED gasoline blended with a maximum of 15% ethanol and an 87 octane rating. Do not use E85 (ethanol), diesel, fuel-methanol, leaded fuel or any other fuel because it could damage or impair the emission control system.

FUEL-EFFICIENT TRANSMISSION

Your vehicle has been designed to improve fuel economy by reducing fuel usage while coasting or decelerating. This may be perceived as a light to medium braking sensation when removing your foot from the accelerator pedal.

TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM

Your vehicle is equipped with a Tire Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) that displays a low tire pressure warning light when one or more of your tires are significantly under-inflated. If this happens, stop and check your tires as soon as possible. Inflate them to the proper pressure. Refer to the *Inflating Your Tires* section in the *Wheels and Tires* chapter of your *Owner's Manual* for more information.

LOCATION OF SPARE TIRE AND TOOLS

The temporary spare tire is located under the vehicle, just forward of the rear bumper. The temporary spare is designed for emergency use only and you should replace it as soon as possible. The jack and tools are in the access panel on the floor behind the third-row seat. Make sure that you switch off the deployable running boards* as well as the automatic load leveling suspension system* prior to jacking, hoisting or towing your vehicle. For complete details on how to change your tire, refer to the *Wheels and Tires* chapter in your *Owner's Manual*.

REAR WINDOW BUFFETING

You may hear a pulsing noise when one or both of the rear windows are open. Lower a front window slightly to reduce this noise.
