audio system



tuner

Press to manually go up or down the radio frequency. Also in menu in mode for various settings.

phone / mute

Press to mute the playing media. Press again to return to playing media.

seek

Press Seek to access the next strong station. In CD mode, press Seek to access the next track.

memory presets

To set a station: select frequency band AM/FM; turn to a station, press and hold a preset button until sound returns.

menu

Press to toggle through the following modes: Treble, Bass, Balance, Fade, Speed Sensitive Volume, Setting the Clock and Autoset.

aux

Press to toggle between FES/DVD and AUX modes.

text

In CD mode, this feature reads track name, artist name and disc name (if available).

shuffle

Press to play tracks in random order. Press again to stop.

comp (compression)

In CD mode, brings soft and loud CD passages together for more consistent listening level.

interior features

06

check engine warning lamp

This light indicates that the On-Board Diagnostic System has detected a malfunction. If this light illuminates or blinks during driving, drive at a moderate speed and have engine serviced immediately. For complete details on all the Warning Lights, please see your Owner's Manual.

07

check fuel cap warning lamp

This light illuminates when the fuel cap may not be properly installed. If this light illuminates during driving, stop the car, turn off the ignition and re-install the cap. For complete details on all the Warning Lights, please see your Owner's Manual.

08

hood release

The hood release for your vehicle is located under the bottom left hand corner of the instrument panel.

09

headlamp control

Turns the lamps off. Turns on the Parking lamps, instrument panel lamps, license plate lamps and tail lamps. Turns the headlamps on.

Autolamp control

Rotate the control counterclockwise to turn autolamp on. Rotate the control clockwise to turn autolamps off.

Daytime Running Lamps

Turn key to ON position. Turn headlamp control to OFF, parking lamps or autolamp position.

High Beams

Push the lever toward the instrument panel to activate. Pull the lever towards you to deactivate.

10

adjustable pedals

Press and hold the rocker control to adjust accelerator and brake pedal toward or away from you.

Daytime Running Lamps

Turn key to ON position. Indicator light will illuminate when it's on. Indicator light remains on 10 minutes and then times out.

11

message center controls

With your ignition in the ON position, the message center [symbol], located on your instrument cluster, displays important vehicle information.

Info

This control displays the following options: Odometer, Distance to Empty, Trip Odometer, Average Fuel Economy, Trip Elapsed Drive Time, and Display On/Off.

Setup

Press this control for the following displays: Language, Units (English/Metric), System Check.

Reset

Press this control to select and reset functions shown in the INFO and SETUP menus.

setting the analog clock

Press the right + control to move the display forward. Press the left - control to move the time backwards.

13

setting the digital clock (on radio)

Press MENU until SELECT HOUR or SELECT MINUTE is displayed. Use SEL to manually increase [symbol] or decrease [symbol] the hours/minutes. Press MENU again to disengage clock mode.

14

speed control

The controls for Speed Control are located on your steering wheel. Press the ON control and release it. Accelerate to desired speed. Press the SET + control and release it. Take your foot off the accelerator pedal. The indicator light on the instrument cluster will turn on. To disengage Speed Control, depress the brake pedal.

steering wheel controls

Press MEDIA to select AM, FM1, FM2, TAPE or CD. In radio mode: Press SEEK to select a preset station from memory. In tape mode: Press SEEK to listen to the next selection on the tape. In CD mode: Press SEEK to listen to the next track on the disc.

16

audio system

Please see the other side of this Quick Reference Guide for detailed information on your Audio System.

17

low tire pressure warning system

This light illuminates when the low tire warning system is enabled. Tire pressure should be checked if this light remains on while driving. For complete details on all the Warning Lights, please see your Owner's Manual.

18

climate control system

Your vehicle is equipped with a climate control system. The basic functions of this system are described below:

Temperature selection

Controls the temperature of the airflow in vehicle.

Air flow selections

Controls the direction of the airflow in the vehicle.

MAX A/C

Uses recirculated air to cool the vehicle.

Specific details of the operation of these systems are determined by the Climate Control System with which your vehicle is equipped. For complete details, please see your vehicle Owner's Manual.
